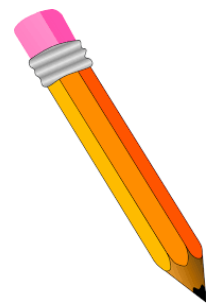


Stars of the Week Certificates

This issue we have Articles 16 to 18:

Article 16

You have the right to privacy.

Article 17

You have the right to get information that is important to your well-being, from radio, newspaper, books, computers and other sources. Adults should make sure that the information you are getting is not harmful, and help you find and understand the information you need.

Article 18

You have the right to be raised by your parent(s) if possible.

Votes for Schools

Recent topics discussed by children in 'Votes for Schools' have included climate change and vaccinations.

A small majority of Key Stage 2 children (52% go 48%) voted that it was not fair to shut down a city over climate change, while a small majority of Key Stage 1 children (53% to 47%) said that they would go to a climate change protest. 68% of children agreed that parents should decide whether to vaccinate their children (Key Stage 2), with 32% against. This compared to 77% and 23% nationally.

This week the children are debating 'Do social media companies listen enough to young people?' in Key Stage 2 and 'Do we treat strangers differently online than in real life?' in Key Stage 1. Please take the opportunity to talk about these topical issues with your children at home.

Speechmaking celebration

Children in Key Stage 2 have been learning how to deliver and create speeches for this year's speechmaking celebration on the theme 'My Local Community'. This has given the children an opportunity to develop their self-confidence and oracy skills. A child from each class will be chosen to deliver their final speech in our special sharing assembly held on Wednesday 12th June (year 3 and year 4) and Thursday 13th June (year 5 and year 6). Three finalists will then be chosen from amongst those children to participate in the official Speechmaking Celebration to be held on Friday 21st June 2019 at Wanstead High School.

Victory in football tournament
