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Maths Marvels Multiplied

Children and staff engaged in a fun-packed day of maths activities at Eastbury last Friday 1st November.

Holding a Maths Day is now a well-established tradition here at Eastbury Primary. Once again, the children showed great imagination in their choice of amazing maths-themed costumes and they all enthusiastically took part in the carousel of the morning activities. Older children designed games for younger ones and together they tested them out.

Mr Wilson led the afternoon assemblies where class champions competed with each other in head-to-head displays of arithmetical strength, with the rest of the school cheering them on.

Thank you to all the staff and children for making it a wonderful day of learning, which proved once again that maths is fun and is found all around us in our daily lives.







Every week children discuss a 'Votes for Schools' topic, which helps boost their oracy skills, as well as increasing their knowledge and understanding of current affairs. It is also great for parents to discuss these topics with their children at home.

Last week, children debated the topic of whether super-size classes are the future and the effects it could have on the education system. The vast majority of children felt that super-size classes are not the future (72% to 28%), which is similar to the national results (69% to 31%).

Parents' Evening sign up

New playground equipment

Many parents (and children) have been asking about when the new playground equipment will be open to the children. The main playground and year one playground equipment, as well as the soft rubber surfaces, have now been fully installed and laid.

The safety of the children is our highest priority and we are therefore awaiting the Health and Safety Inspector from the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (ROSPA) to inspect the equipment before it is used by the children. Following this inspection, there will be a risk assessment by the school leadership team, which will include

placing a limit on the number of children who can use the equipment at any one time.

The picket fence which will surround the main playground equipment has also arrived and is in process of putting this together. The playground equipment will not be in use at the end of the day and we would be grateful if you would ensure that your children do not use the equipment after you have picked them up from school.

Next Friday(15th November) we will be celebrating this annual fundraising event by asking all children to come to school in their pyjamas and donate a £1 to Children in Need.





Children's Rights

Every newsletter we share the children's rights set out in the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. All the rights (called Articles) – in child friendly language – can be found at https://www.unicef.org/rightsite/files/uncrcchilldfriendlylanguage.pdf

We will be celebrating these rights in our Children's Rights Day planned for 17 January 2020. In this newsletter, we have Articles 40 to 42, which includes the right for every child to know their rights!

Article 40

You have the right to legal help and fair treatment in the justice system that respects your rights.

Article 41

If the laws of the country provide better protection of your rights than the articles in this Convention, those laws should apply.

Article 42

You have the right to know your rights! Adults should know about these rights and help you learn about them too.



Eastbury's fabulous new Reading Hut was officially opened by Councillor Evelyn Carpenter on Tuesday, 29th October.

Two years ago the children asked the school to create an area in the playground where they could read. The Friends of Eastbury rose to this challenge and have been raising money since this request was made. They have worked incredibly hard and, with support of the school's staff, have organised our annual Summer Picnic and Winter Wonderland, enabling all our families to participate in these enjoyable events.

Our parents have been incredibly supportive throughout the fundraising campaign and have been wonderfully generous in donating all the books that line the shelves of the Reading Hut. We are delighted that the whole school community have worked together to create a fantastic outdoor reading area to encourage a love of reading in every child.

At the launch, Councillor Evelyn Carpenter, said: "I'm extremely proud of everyone at Eastbury who was involved in this project."



Change to end of school day

From Monday 11th November, there will be a small change to the time of the end of the school day for Reception and for Key Stage 1 (years 1 and 2). The timings of the school day for Nursery and Key Stage 2 (years 3 to 6) will remain unchanged.

The new timings are as follows:

The change to the Reception and Key Stage 1 times means that parents and carers who are collecting children in different key stages will not have to wait in the playground for as long at the end of the day. When picking up your children, we kindly request that you stand behind the new painted line markings.

The decision on the change to the end of the school day has been agreed by governors following a consultation with parents and carers. All responses to this consultation were in favour of the change and we would like to thank everyone who responded.
