The activities were a fun way for the children to learn about bullying, the harm it can cause and what to do about it.

The anti-bullying ambassadors will meet next week to discuss how the day went and what they learnt from their friends. Throughout the year the ambassadors will then work hard to make Eastbury a bullying-free zone!





Votes for Schools

Every week children discuss a 'Votes for Schools' topic, which helps boost their oracy skills, as well as increasing their knowledge and understanding of current affairs. It is also great for parents to discuss these topics with their children at home.

Last week, children debated the extremely important topic of whether it is possible to reduce bullying in our school. The vast majority of children (85% to 15%) voted that it was.
