


Play structure fully open

Working together to support your child

- •Give your child your full attention while they talk to you.

Please do not try to resolve any issues with other parents or children in the playground - allow staff to address these on behalf of your child.

Year 6 visit the offices of EY

On 10th January, a group of children from year 6 visited the offices of EY (Ernst and Young) on the banks for the River Thames at London Bridge. The children were inspired by hearing from EY employees, including our parent governor, Zaheer Ahmad MBE, about their careers and what life is like working in a global professional services firm. They produced some wonderful posters displaying what they had learnt.

We would like to thank Zaheer for organising this visit and providing the children with such a great opportunity.

Votes for Schools

Every week children discuss a 'Votes for Schools' topic, which helps boost their oracy skills, as well as increasing their knowledge and understanding of current affairs. It is also great for parents to discuss these topics with their children at home.

Last week children were debating whether 2019 was an important year. Children discussed some of the key events and people of the year, such as Greta Thunberg encouraging people to look after the environment and Boris Johnson becoming Prime Minister. Overall, 67% of children at Eastbury voted that 2019 was an important year, while 33% disagreed. This is similar to the national vote with 73% agreeing and 27% disagreeing.

This week children have been discussing whether they would be willing to go vegetarian or vegan for a month.



Police workshops have taken place this week for years 5 and 6. The topics covered were:

- •Crime and consequences
- Gangs and knife crime
- Online safety

The children listened very well and they are now able to understand how the above areas can easily become out of their control. The workshop provided the children with the knowledge to help them to make the right choices and to stay safe.

The children and staff have been working extremely hard to create exciting reading corners and displays which encourage a love of reading.

Antony Lishak Project

There has been a group of 19 children that have been working with children's author Antony Lishak over the last two terms. They have been working on understanding the impact of the Holocaust upon the Jewish community. They have also been looking at how they could help others that find themselves in situations where they are being persecuted or bullied.

The children have really enjoyed being able to work with Antony on this project, and have created some fantastic art work that depicts the difficulties facing the Jewish community during World War Two. They have also written some beautiful and emotive poems, which are very powerful to read.

As part of the project some of the children will be sharing their views and opinions at the 75th Anniversary of the Liberation of Auschwitz - one of the worst concentration camps during World War Two, that killed over 1 million Jewish and other minorities.

This has been an amazing opportunity for the children to express their opinions about injustice and how they think they can prevent future injustices in the world.

Term time absence

Absence during school time can have a major impact on your child's education as they miss out on important learning and may fall behind the rest of their class. All requests for absence during term time will <u>not</u> be authorised and you may be subject to an FPN (fixed penalty notice). If an FPN is issued this can be up to £240 per child.

If you plan for your child to be absent during term time then you must complete an absence form from the school office in advance. All forms are then passed on to the Co-Headteachers.

Best attending classes

Children who have good attendance at school are likely to make more progress and do better in their learning. Our whole school target is 97% attendance and all children who have 100% attendance during the year receive a special certificate.
