

Hot Water bottle is made from rubber. It is bendy so that you can move it around.


The door is made from wood. It is hard so that it doesn't break.

To make a table I would use wood because if it isn't strong my stuff will break.


To make a car I would use metal because it's strong.

To make a jumper I would use fabric because it's comfortable.




Year 3 have been creating their own Egyptian sarcophagus models. They look just like the real thing!








Conclusion

- Can be worked in any order.
- Some more difficult.
- Designed to relieve suffering.
- Buddhism works on promoting learning and self-discovery.
- Right understanding – see the world how it is not how we want it to be.
- Sometimes try to change things outside of our control.
- Right intent – means we can commit to a decision for the right reasons.
- Once understand properly looking what is really there and not what we want it to be.
- Things we say in anger or gossip can upset or hurt.
- Right speech – deciding never to speak unkindly or in anger.
- Right action – means behaving in a thoughtful way.
- Considering others and the world we live in.
- Our actions keep the world safe for future generations.
- How we chose to work and earn money can have an effect on the world.
- Buddhists don't agree with harming animals.
- They believe that we should work for the good of the world.
- We sometimes put effort into the wrong things.
- Right effort is putting effort into the right things.
