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
Welcome back to another year of learning, growing, fun and laughter and celebrating our wonderful pupils.



In Religious Education, Year 3 have been learning about Hinduism and created these beautiful rangoli patterns.




In English, Year 5 pupils were in the role of the young god Prometheus and created human beings from clay.






In Computing, Year 6 pupils have been learning about input and output devices. They are now using BBC Dance mat typing to learn to type.
