

# OUTDOOR LEARNING at Eastbury!

Have a look at the exciting outdoor learning taking place at Eastbury this summer term!

## *The Great Fire of London*

Year 2 were very excited to meet fire fighters from Barking fire station as part of their History topic - The Great Fire of London. The children were looking at the equipment that fire fighters use today so that they can compare to the equipment in 1666.

In another lesson, the children went outside to test out the 1666 method of putting out a fire and let them see how easy or difficult it would have been back then.



## *Plants and Animals*

Year 5 children visited Mayesbrook Park to summarise their topic 'Reproduction in Plants and Animals'. They had a great time, starting with a class picnic followed by a super exciting Minibeast hunt. As well as this, children explored the variety of plants at the park.







## Role play

In year 3, we have been learning about mystery stories. Here are some freeze frames from one of the stories we have been learning about. Can you guess what is happening?



## Measuring and Comparing

In Science, year 1 have enjoyed observing, comparing and describing trees in the environment. The children also explored different tree patterns and types of trees as they created tree rubbings using paper and crayons!



## Victorian Era

On the left, Year 4 have been looking at a historical story from the Victorian era. They used the emotions of the characters to create their own playscript.








## Doubling numbers

The children in Reception have been learning about what doubling means! They used numicon and chalk to write their number sentences on the ground. They also used their fingers to check their answer was correct! By the end of the activity the children were able to recall simple double facts!



## Nursery outdoor learning

The children in nursery enjoyed building castles in the sand with their friends, working on their balancing skills, learning to ride a trike and cooking in the mud kitchen.



## Materials & Oliver Twist

Year 6 were comparing different materials in the outdoor areas. The children have also enjoyed reading the last chapter of Oliver Twist in the reading hut! They then summarised the story during their reading lesson.
