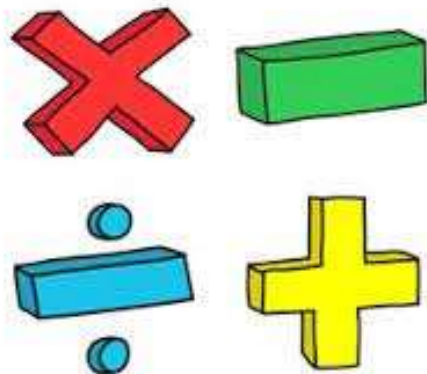
Year 3

Year 4

Year 5

To bring their Geography topic to life Year 5 visited the Sky Roof Garden at Canary Wharf. The botanical gardens, housed at the top of the man-made building, was interesting for children as they thought all the wildlife inside the garden were models, until they saw workers planting seeds and feeding the birds! They were able to explore and observe buildings which also linked to their Art topic.



Year 6

Year six have been on a visit to the Ben Kinsella Foundation workshop to change young people's attitudes to knife crime; busting the myth that carrying a knife will protect you. They spent some time learning how to strengthen peer values; ensuring that they can give better advice to each other and challenge their peers who are carrying (or thinking of carrying) a knife. Our children said that they had learned about the dangers of knife crime and the workshops can help them to make positive choices to stay safe.

Sunshine Room

Children in the Sunshine Room have been reading 'Walking through the Jungle'. They explored different animals using puppets, as well as a range of textures using sensory trays. Our Sunshine children made mountains to learn about different environments. They have been using their senses to explore hot and cold temperatures. The children really enjoyed making their Easter bonnets and chocolate nest.
