- Help you understand the SEN process, including in school support for those without an EHC Plan
- If you are a young person or a parent carer, we can help you to express yours and your child's views and aspirations to be included in Education Health Care Plan (EHC) process
- Space to talk and time to listen; we take your views seriously
- Support at meetings such as School Meetings, Reviews, Annual Reviews, Mediation Meetings and Transition
- We can mediate on your behalf and ensure your voice is heard
- Practical help, including the writing of letters, emails, forms etc.



- Support in talking with professionals to help you express your views
- Preparation and support for meetings
- Preparation for and during tribunal
- Telephone support
- Regular newsletter
- Access to training
- Signposting to other in-house projects and other appropriate services
