
Did You Know...?


The English language has:

26 letters

44 sounds

over 100 ways to spell those sounds





Phonics Terminology

systematic synthetic phonics - The teaching of reading and spelling by breaking down words into the smallest unit of sound.

phoneme - Any one of the 44 sounds which make up words in the English language.

grapheme – How a phoneme is written down. There can be more than one way to spell a phoneme. For example, the phoneme 'ai' is spelt differently in each of the words 'way', 'make', 'fail', 'great', 'sleigh' and 'lady'.

blending – Putting together the sounds in a word in order to read it, e.g. 'f – r - o - g, frog'.

segmenting – Breaking a word into its constituent sounds in order to spell them, e.g. 'frog, f - r - o - g'.





Who is Read Write Inc. for?






Phonics is for children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 who are learning to read. Phonics is also for children in Y3 and Y4 who haven't met the KS1 reading expectations.


Read Write Inc. Phonics daily lessons

Children are taught reading and spelling daily throughout the week and each session will follow a structured format.

Teachers will assess children's understanding throughout each session and will also assess knowledge of sounds to see whether a child is ready to move on to the next phase.

Progress groups


- Group children by phonic stages.





Book Bag Books

- Matched to the sounds children know.













One-to-one tutoring – 'keep up, not catch up!'



Virtual Classroom films



How do I use the Virtual Classroom?

- 1. Set aside 10 minutes to watch a film with your child each day.
- 2. Find a quiet space for your child to watch the film on a laptop or tablet.
- 3. Praise your child as they join in with the lesson make it fun!

The more they practise using these films, the quicker they'll learn to read.

What can I do?

- 1. Use pure sounds rather than letter names.
- 2. Use Fred Talk to help your child to read and spell words.
- 3. Listen to your child read their Storybook every day.
- 4. Watch the Virtual Classroom films together.
- 5. Read stories to your child every day.
