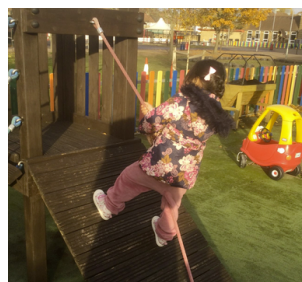
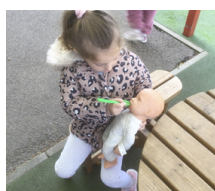

Year 1

Maths

Year 2

History
